

CRITERIA 7.1.7 The Institution has disabled-friendly, barrier free environment

In view of the national strategy for people with disabilities that the Indian government created in February 2006 and which addresses the educational rehabilitation of people with disabilities, JCTCET has applied these policies in the teaching and learning process. The JCTCET's policy attempts to create a climate that offers equal opportunities, protection of their rights, and full participation in the academic environment. It acknowledges that people with disabilities are valuable human resources for the institution. The following is where the policy is concentrated:

1. To make sure that structures with ramps or lifts are designed with people with disabilities in mind.
2. To guarantee that restrooms for the disabled are accessible, gender-sensitive, secure, useable, and functioning.
3. To make sure that the appropriate text and pictogram signage, such as tactile paths, lights, display boards, and signposts, is present and is situated such that it is both visible and touchable.
4. The use of male and female symbols on signage will be more obvious to everyone and especially helpful for people with visual impairments. These symbols should be used in accordance with local standards and customs.
5. Leaders, teaching staff, and college communities that are sensitive to the needs of students with disabilities must provide adequate and appropriate support for them both inside and outside of the classroom. This support must include the proper resources and assistive technology.
6. To guarantee that technology and software tools are accessible to those with impairments.
7. Resources for research and information include readers, scribes, screen readers, readers, and human aid.

Assistive devices are purchased for facilitated mobility, learning and other activities at campus. 2 wheel chairs, Braille Slate, Plastic Stylus, abacus, Taylor Frame, Geometric Kit, Folding cane, Long cane, Tactile Drawing Board, and Stand Magnifier

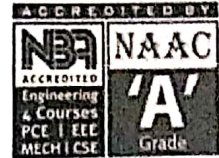
